

# SKIPAT STAKES 6 Furlongs RACE #7 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

**#3 – Chalon** has not raced since the Breeders' Cup Fillies and Mares sprint in November. She has put in some solid works recently suggesting she'll hit the track ready. Her first start off a layoff history includes a place by a head and W in her two-most recent returns off a layoff. Back-class says she is the one to beat.

**#9 – Estilo Femenino** is making her third start off the shelf. Her form is on the upswing as she improved her speed figure and lowered her fractions across the board race-over-race in the first two. She won her last and trainer Steven Asmussen wins back-to-back at 20%.

**#6 - Anna's Bandit** is undefeated in 2019 for a three-race winning streak and has finished in-the-money in seven of her last eight races. Don't let slower fractions in her last race fool you. She was unchallenged after the 1/2 mile-marker and was hand ridden to the wire. She probably has a little extra.

## VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOTS

**#7 – Maybe Wicked** has never missed the board in her five races at the distance/surface with three wins and two seconds in five starts. Her jockey and trainer combo of Florent Geroux and Brad Cox have won 17 of their last 40 races together.

**#1 – Hailey's Flip** has finished in top three in eight of her last 10 races. Six-furlongs is her best distance as she has five wins, two seconds and six thirds in 15 efforts; just wo wins, a second and third at any other length.

**#5 – Adios Annie** showed improved form in her first start in a little more than a month. She cut her ¼ call by 8/10th of a second, her ½ call by 1 9/10ths seconds and 6 furlong time by 1 8/10ths seconds. She could be better in round two off the bench, a 21% winning angle for trainer Gary Capuano.

**Distance/Surface Bias:** Speed carried a major advantage during the 2019 Pimlico meet, winning at 74% with 44% going wire-to-wire.

**Post Position Stats:** The rail ran at a small disadvantage winning at just 9% while the rest of the posts scored evenly.

# THE **PLAY**

**CHALON** has thrived at 6 furlongs with three wins, two seconds and third in six starts. **ESTILO FEMENINO** won her last race running away by 3 ¼ lengths as the favorite; same race should equal similar result. **ANNA'S BANDIT** has won three in a row. Trainer John Robb wins after a win at 20%. His best angle. **MAYBE WICKED's** trainer Brad Cox how to spot his horses, winning non-graded stakes at 27% and at 26% with shippers.

# \*\*ADENA SPRINGS MISS PREAKNESS STAKES (G3) 6 FURLONGS RACE #8 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

**#11 – Fighting Mad** is undefeated in two starts, including an impressive win at Churchill in her last. The Churchill W comes after eight months on the shelf. She had a strong workout after her last race and should be better in round two where trainer Bob Baffert wins at 26%.

**#2 – Covfefe** ran the highest, last race speed figure and the only recorded triple-digit reading for this group. She showed major time improvements in her first start since October 2018 and will be lights out if she's any better today.

#6 – Never Enough Time has not been challenged in her two career starts, both a Laurel Park. She made power moves after the ½ mile in her pair of Ws and could be hard to pass on the lead. A bullet work after her last race with the fastest of thirteen, 5 furlong runs shows she remains as sharp as a sword.

## VALUE PLAYS **AND LONGSHOTS**

#4 – Please Flatter Me is a length away from being undefeated in four starts. She stretched out to a mile in her last and lone miss; so, cutting back to 6 furlongs should help. She has one win in one race at the distance with one of the fastest ¼ and ½ fractions in the field.

**#12 – Midnight Fantasy** hasn't lost at the distance with three wins in three starts. She is moving up in class after recording her best speed figure and second highest for this pack of fillies. Although she is usually quick out of the gate, she might be a touch faster today with blinkers on for the first time.

**#10 – Bye Bye J** has been a monster on fast dirt with four wins and second is five starts. She's also been tough to beat at 6 furlongs with three wins in four starts. The lone out-of-the-money finish at the distance was on an off-track, rated good.

**Early Race Outlook:** The early pace should be quick as five of the 13 contestants tend to get out of the barn in hurry. **COVFEFE** and **PLEASE FLATTER ME** look to be the fleetest of foot in the first few steps. **IVA** has some early speed and should contest early from the rail but has faltered against better competition. **NEVER ENOUGH TIME** and **FIGHTING MAD** should keep the heat on the early leaders and will take charge if the early pace isn't fast enough.

**Distance/Surface Bias:** Speed carried a major advantage during the 2019 Pimlico meet, winning at 74% with 44% going wire-to-wire.

**Post Position Stats:** The rail ran at a small disadvantage winning at just 9% while the rest of the posts scored evenly.

# THE **PLAY**

**FIGHTING MAD's** trainer Bob Baffert places his horses well, winning at 33% with invaders. **COVFEFE's** only miss in three races came in a Grade I as the favorite. She was bumped and the start and forced wide at the turn. She's won her two clean trips without much static. **NEVER ENOUGH TIME** has won both of her races by 5 ½ and 5 ¼ lengths. Experience says she has more and will show it in race number three. **PLEASE FLATTER ME** has put in four works since her last race on March 9th. She's fast out of the box and her extra-practice should give here the stamina to stay on/near the lead all the way around the track.

# HILLTOP STAKES 1 MILE (TURF) RACE #9 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

- **#5 Dogtag** is dropping in class from a G2 where she was brushed at the start and ran fourth all the way around the track behind a very good winner in **NEWSPAPEROFRECORD**. Two start back, she won at this level, beating another good horse in **CHOCOLATE KISSES** who just ran in the Kentucky Oaks.
- **#2 Nova Sol** has three races in France where she finished 3rd, 1st, and 3rd from most recent back. If the trend of alternating holds then... Her last was a Grade 3 where she missed by a length. Trainer Chad Brown knows what he is doing with international shippers, winning at 23%.
- **#12 Orra Moor** might be rated higher if this wasn't her first try on turf. It's only a 16% angle for trainer Todd Pletcher. She is dropping in class and just missed two races ago in \$250,000 non-graded stakes, despite being forced wide and bumped. Her recent work on turf suggest she might take to the surface nicely.

## VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOT

- **#6 Makeme Dream** came off the bench to run the highest, speed figure for her two career starts. She finished second by <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>s of a length; otherwise, she'd be undefeated. Despite placing, she improved her 6 furlong and mile times by almost two-seconds each. If she shows more in round two, lookout.
- **#3 Fashion Faux Pas** is another lady with improving form. She's stretching out to a route for the first time, which scores at 31% for trainer Arnaud Delacour. It's possible that she is lone speed and can control the pace of the race. We really thought long and hard about placing her higher.
- **#9 Introduced** is two noses away from a three-race win streak and has never finished worse than second (4: 1-3-0). She's hit the turf three times with three seconds. She's never races more than 6 furlongs and has faded a touch late in her three grass goes. The extra distance is concerning.

She might get to the second position but its doubtful she'll be able to hold on for long.

**Post Position Stats:** Insufficient Data with only four races.

# THE **PLAY**

**DOGTAG** has a win in two races on turf while facing some high-quality horses. She's probably a touch better than \$100k non-graded stakes. **NOVA SOL's** trainer/jockey combo of Chad Brown and Irad Ortiz, Jr is a dynamic duo, winning 12 of their last 28 together. The only question for **ORRA MOOR** is can she bring her dirt form to grass? Her recent workout on Belmont grass says yes. **MAKEME DREAM** has a win and a second in two races on turf. The funny thing is the she ran a better race when she didn't win. It's her second off a layoff today, a 20% angle for trainer Christoph Clement.

# PIMLICO SPECIAL STAKES (G3) 1 1/4 MILE S RACE #10 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

**#1 – War Story i**s making his second start after more than five-months in the barn. His back-class rates him a top tier contender and he should be better in race number two; a 28% winning angle for trainer Jorge Navarro.

**#8 – Tenfold** finished second as the public's choice in his last race. Trainer Steven Asmussen wins at 26% the next time around the track with beaten favorites.

**#11 – Flameaway** is another that failed as the chalk in his last race, finishing sixth. Trainer Mark Casse wins at 25% with beaten favs in their next outing. He's also a speed horse in a field that lacks a lot of pace, He should be on/near the lead all the way around the park.

## VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOTS

**#12 – Wait for It** tied for the highest, last race speed rating for this deep field. He's finished first (4x), second (2x) or third (2x) in eight of his last 10 efforts. He's been equally effective on fast or wet surfaces; so, upgrade with water.

**#2 – Rally Cry** is making his second start after a layoff or more than seven-months. Trainer Todd Pletcher win round number two at 23% and graded stakes at 15%.

**#13 - You're to Blame** is 1 ½ lengths away from a four-race win streak. He's been his best on a fast surface with six wins, four seconds and four thirds in 18 races.

War Story, Carlino, Heavy Roller, Cordmaker, Just Whistle, Bobby G, Clubman **Early Race Outlook: FLAMEAWAY** and **WAIT FOR IT** should drag race first and seconds, in either order, down the front-stretch before heading into the first tun. **FLYING THE FLAG** sis likely to pull up right behinds them with **RALLY CRY** playing chase.

**Distance/Surface Bias:** Early speed owned a mild-bias during last year's meet, winning 19 of 34 races at the distance; six of the 19 front runners went wire-to-wire.

**Post Position Stats:** The rail through the three-hole won evenly with posts four through seven owing an edge. There were zero winners from post eight and out. That could be because not many fields had more than eight horses.

# THE **PLAY**

**WAR STORY** put in a bullet workout following his first race off the bench since November 2, 2018. He should be better today. **TENFOLD** is making the classic third start after a layoff, a 22% winner for trainer Steve Asmussen. **FLAMEAWAY** will try to lead them from gate-to-wire in a field without a lot of front end speed. WAIT FOR IT showed a major improvement in form, reducing his final 1 mile 70 yard time by more than two-seconds compared to previous races at the distance.

# BLACK-EYED SUSAN STAKES (G2) 1 1/8TH MILES RACE #11 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

- **#6 Always Shopping** ran her best speed figure in her first race in two-months. She should be better in her second race off the bench, a 23% winning angle for trainer Todd Pletcher. She's finished first (2x and two in a row) or second (2x) in her last four races.
- **#8 Point of Honor** has been heavily bet in her three outings with two wins and a fourth. Despite finishing fourth in her last race, the George Weaver trainee finished the 1 1/16 mile race almost two-seconds faster than the previous race at the same distance.
- **#9 Las Setas** has won four straight races, all at Laurel Park. She upped her game in her last races, running 1 1/16 miles while lowering her 6 furlong fraction by more than 1.5 seconds.

## VALUE PLAYS **AND LONGSHOTS**

- #4 Cookie Dough has finished in the money in six of seven races with two wins, a second and three thirds. She'll try to race on/near the lead all the way around the track.
- **#7 Brill** is making her third start following a six-month racing hiatus. Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer wins start number three at 21%. She has hit the board in four of her five starts (5: 1-1-2).
- **#3 Ulele** has finished first (2x), second (1x) or third (2x) in her five starts. She ran he top speed figure winning her last and first race since mid-February. Trainer Brad Cox follows a W with a W at 30%.

# JIM MCKAY TURF SPRINT STAKES (G1T) 5 FURLONGS (TURF) RACE #12 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

#4 - Bellafina has won six of her last seven races and most of them haven't been close. She hopped and was bumped at the start of the lone miss. Otherwise, she has six wins and a second in eight races. She's the one to beat.

#7 - Jaywalk got the best of BELLAFINA in their last encounter but it was the race where BELLA had a rough start. She's making her third start after a four-month layoff and should be in peak form, looking to win round two against the favorite.

**#8 - Motion Emotion** came in second two races in a row as the favorite. Trainer Thomas Van Berg wins at 20% the next time out with disappointing chalk. She looks to be cycling into top form as she cut nearly twoseconds off her 1 1/16-mile time in her last race.

## VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOTS

#3 - Lady Apple is in a three-race win streak and cut almost two seconds off her final 1 1/16-mile time in her last. That's usually a good sign that a horse is peaking. Trainer Steve Asmussen tends to win after winning, scoring at 20%.

#14 - Restless Rider came off the shelf to run her lifetime, top speed figure. That's a fun angle. Her history suggests she'll only be better in round two. She's been strong at Churchill and strong on a fast surface, never missing the board in either.

#15 - Dunbar Road (AE) could play the role of spoiler if she scratches into the race. She finished second as the favorite in her last race, missing by just a ½ length. Trainer Chad Brown bounces back with beaten chalk at a nice 30%.

# ALLAIR DUPONT DISTAFF STAKES (G3) 1 1/8 MILES RACE #13 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

- **#4 Mylady Curlin** has won two races in a row. Trainer Brad Cox follows a win with a win at 30%. She finished in the top three for six of her seven of fast dirt races (7: 3-2-1).
- **#2 My Miss Lilly** finished third as the favorite in her last race. Trainer Mark Henning bounces back at 15% with disappointing chalk. She has a win and a third in three at the distance.
- **#6 Golden Award** failed as the favorite in her last race. Trainer William Mott gets DQ into wins... scratch that, he comes back to win at 22% with upset chalk in the next race.

## VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOTS

- **#3 Gio Game** came off the sidelines to score a W in her first race back since August 2018. She should be better in round two as her second race history says to expect a big performance boost.

# SIR BARTON STAKES 1 1/16TH MILES RACE #3 - ANALYSIS OF TOP CONTENDERS

- **#3 King for a Day** tied for the highest, last race speed rating and is dropping in class. He's returning to work for the first time since November 24, 2018, but that's OK as trainer Todd Pletcher wins at 30% with horse coming back from breaks of 90-days or more.
- #4 Top Line Growth won his debut in smashing style, racing away by 9 ½ lengths in a wire-to-wire W at Laurel Park. The same race should equal a similar result.
- **#6 V. I. P. Ticket** has won four in a row and is moving up in class. The win streak started when jockey Angel Suarez climbed aboard. Prior to his jockey switch, he finished third in three straight outings. He's learned how to hit the board in 2019.

## VALUE PLAYS AND LONGSHOTS

- #2 Pretty Good Year has been steadily improving and didn't miss by much in his last effort. He's going from a sprint to a route, a 19% winning angle for trainer Kelly Rubley.
- **#1 Trifor Gold** finished second in his first non-graded stakes race but fell short by 11 lengths in a five-horse field. He did top **PRETTY GOOD YEAR** two races back, but his fractions fell off a touch in his last races, which is concerning.
- **#5 Tone Broke** did some damage in Steve Asmussen's barn before heading off to the United Arab Emirates, but it got U-G-L-Y for him in Dubai, losing by a combined 80-lenghts in two races. Now he's back with Asmussen but might need to rebuild some confidence before we are confident enough to pick him.

He was on the lead early in his two in-themoney finishes; so, expect him to do what's earned a check.

**Distance/Surface Bias:** Twelve of the last 20 Preakness winners ran in the top three at the ¼ pole with four winning wire-to-wire.

**Post Position Stats:** Only three of the last 20 Preakness winners left from gates one, two, or three (one each). Most of the action has come from post six and out with 13 of the last 20 winners.

## THE PLAY

**ANOTHERTWISTAFATE** finished second as the favorite in his last despite being bothered at the start and boxed in. Trainer Blaine Wright wins as 26% the next time around the track with defeated chalk. **IMPROBABLE** is probably the most consistent runner in the field. He gets a jockey upgrade to Mike Smith today; so, he should get a no excuses trip. **ALWAYSMINING** has been stomping on the competition at Laurel Park. He's put in two great workouts since his last race. Let the stomping continue. **WAR OF WILL** won two of three on fast dirt. The lone miss was when he took a bad step and got injured. He was on the leader's tail in the Kentucky Derby (literally). Shortening by 1/16th should help his chances.
